- ONLY 1 PERSON OUT OF 50 THINKS IT HAS NO SIGNIFICANCE



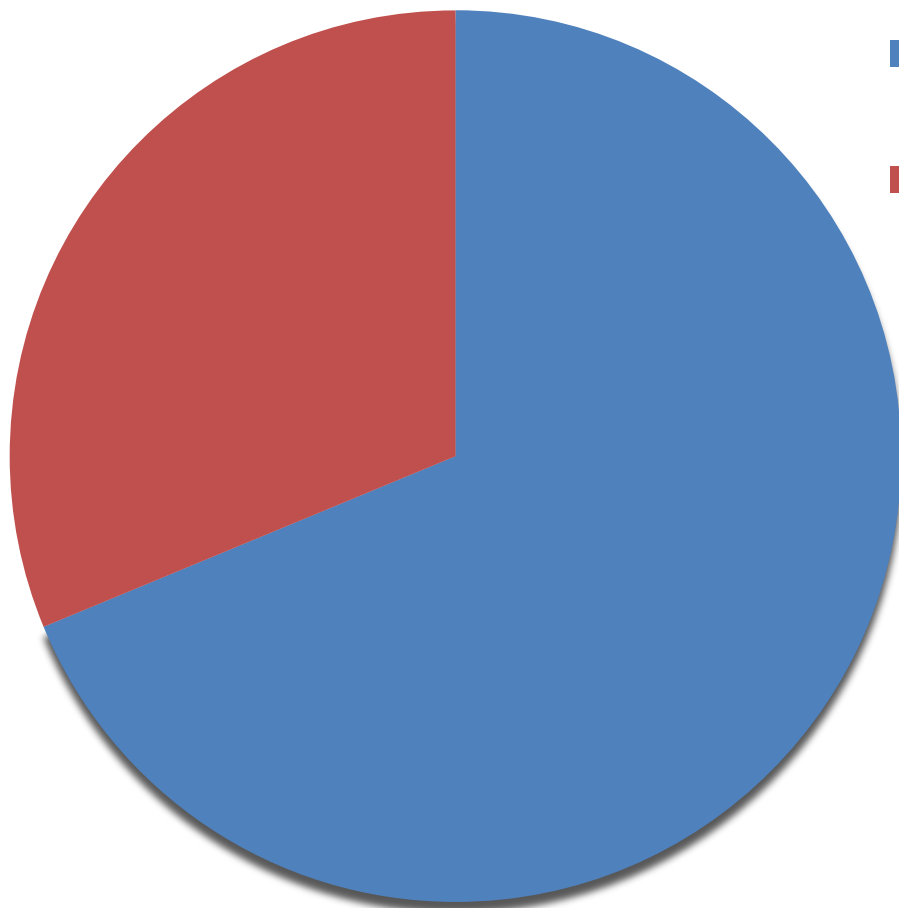
3. Is sorting of waste important in your local community?

■ 30% do not have enough information

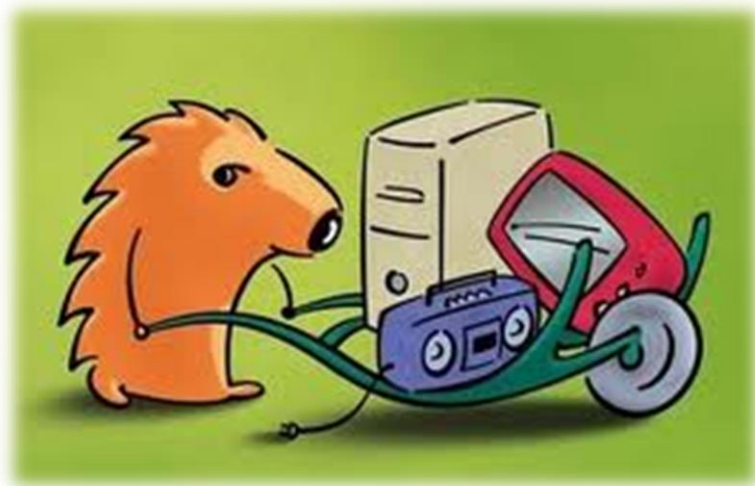
5. How would you rate our knowledge about waste sorting?

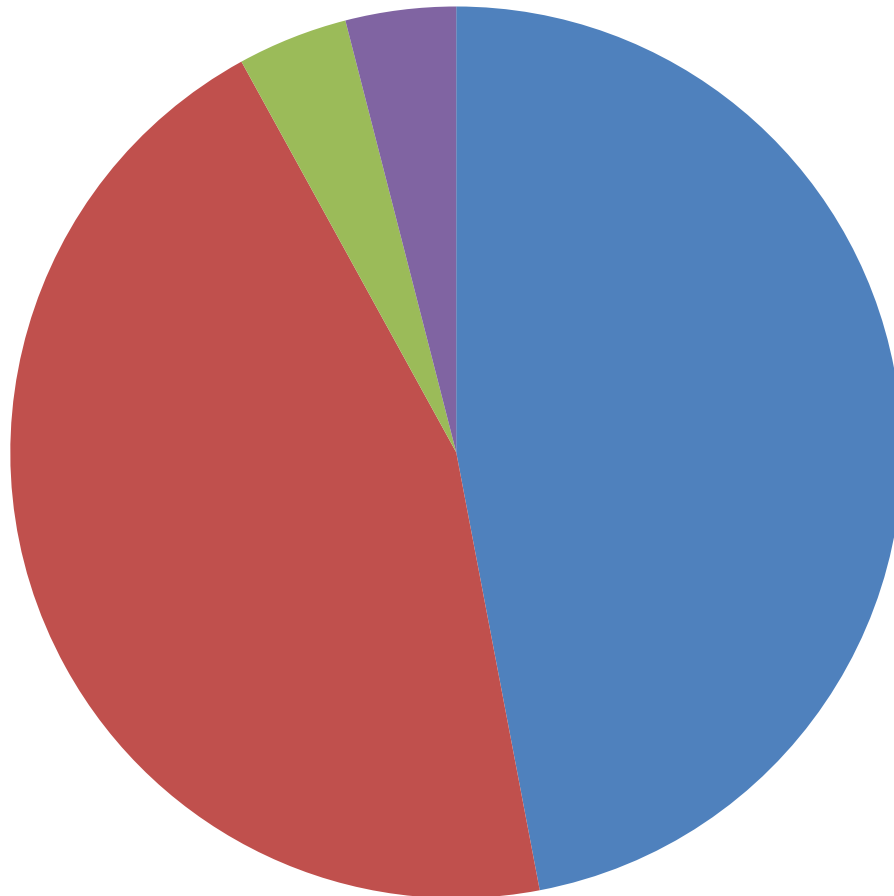


**57% think the level of

waste?**

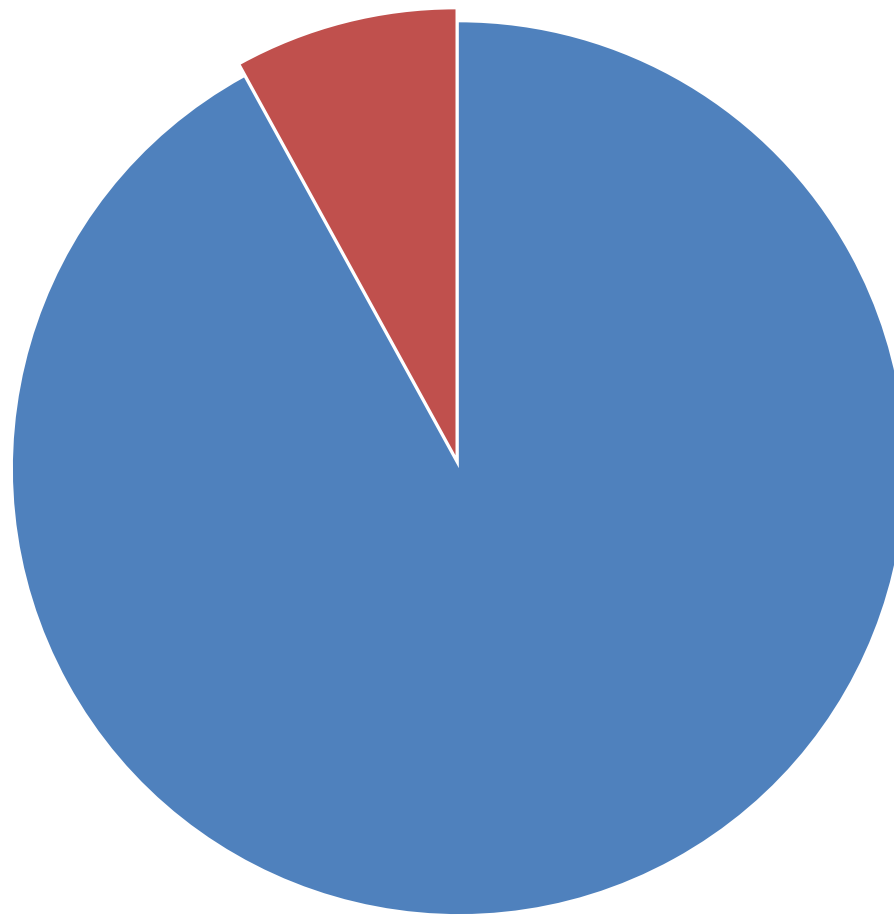




- 47% sort waste AT LEAST ONCE A DAY

7. Is there a waste sorting-system in place where you live?

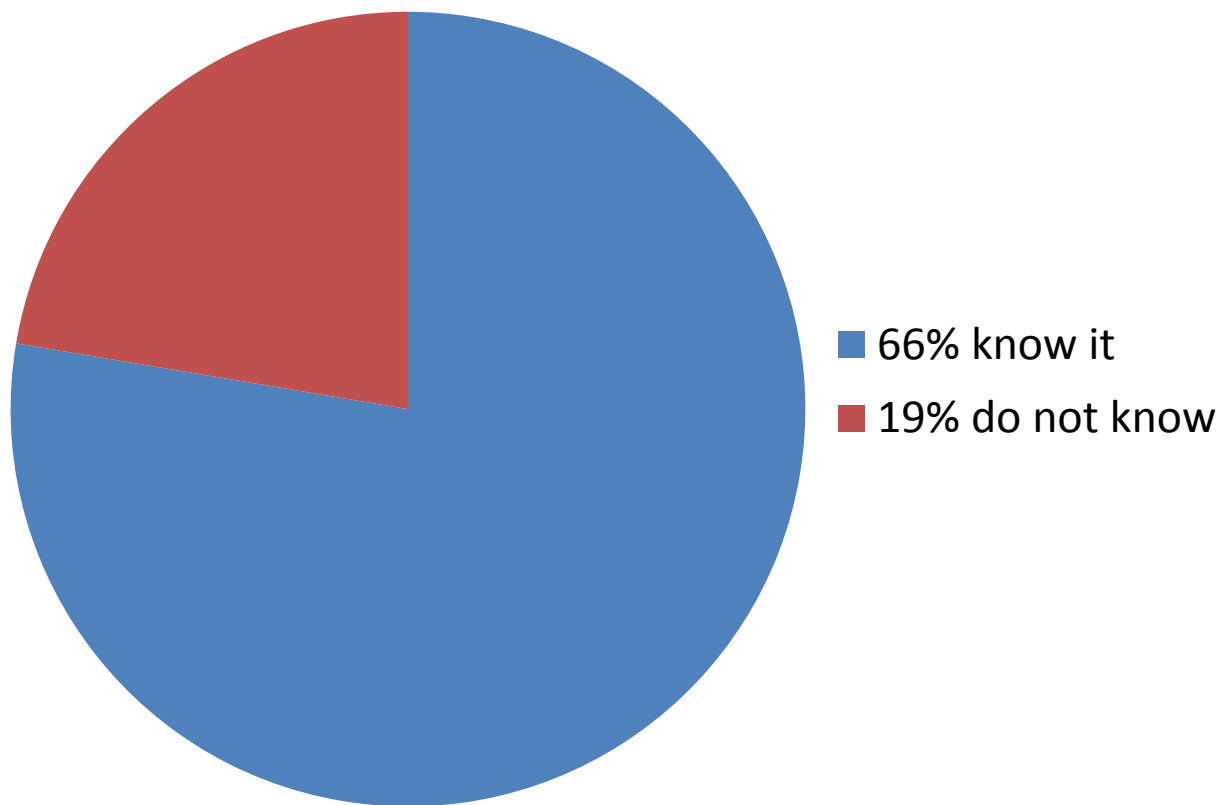




■ 92% YES
■ 8% NO

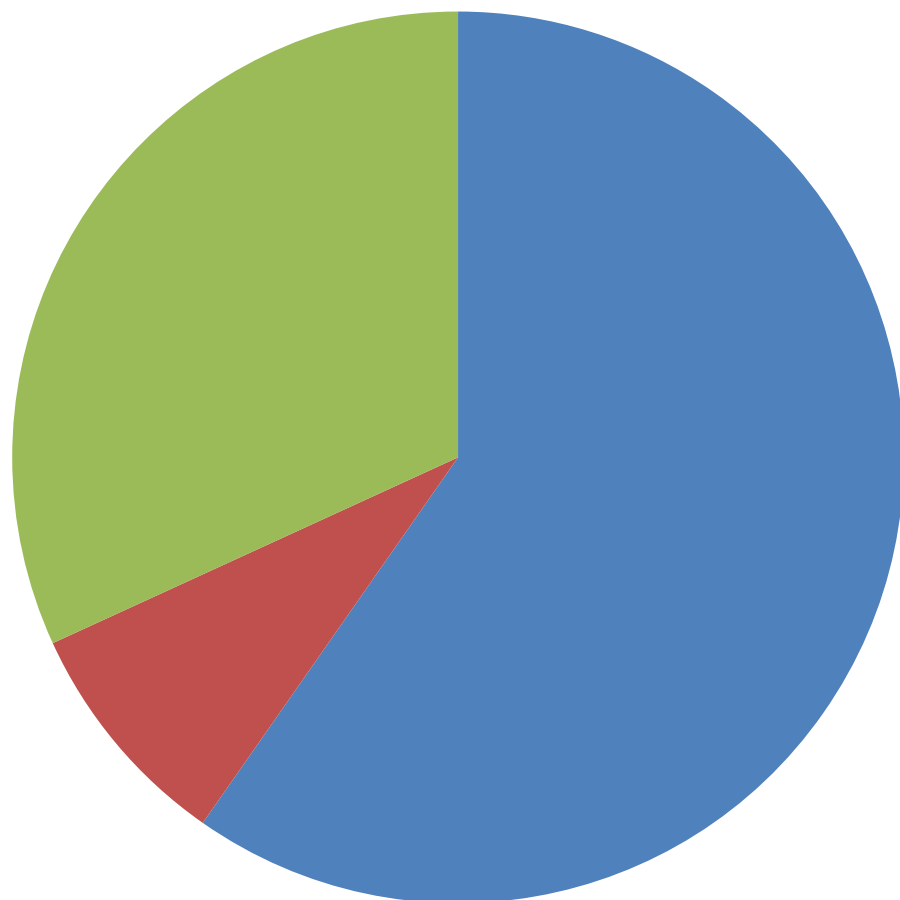
8. Are you familiar with the location of your nearest recycling station?





9. What happens to compostable (biodegradable) waste in your home?





- 60% composte waste themselves
- 8,5 their municipality composts it
- 32% throw it with other household waste - mostly Brno



OPEN QUESTIONS

10. What is the biggest obstacle for waste sorting in your everyday life?

Nothing: 53%

Other reasons: - not enough containers (containers are full)

- Containers are too far from our house/flat
- Lack of time – 13%
- Not much space at home (Brno)
- They do not have a chance to sort waste (Brno)
- Laziness (some people admit)

11. Can you give any example on how you could simplify/improve waste disposing in an ordinaly family's everyday life?

NOTHING: 38% - nobody from Brno, mostly students from small villages, it means they are satisfied with the system

What should be done:

- Give detailed information about sorting
- Containers at home
- Containers in the street (in every street)
- TV reports from landfills
- Every family should sort waste

12. Do you have anything else to add or other Ideas on how waste disposal could be improved in the future?

IN THE FUTURE EVERYBODY SHOULD SORT WASTE

How motivate people:

- Either financial benefits for families sorting waste or fines
- To persuade people that sorting waste has a sense
- Packages – should be made of biodegradeble materials (paper bags
- Waste should be recycled more

CONCLUSION

WASTE IS MUCH MORE SORTED IN SMALL VILLAGES AND SMALL TOWNS, THEY ARE MOST SATISFIED WITH THE SYSTEM OF SORTING AND RECYCLING.

ON THE CONTRARY IN BRNO THEY HAVE CONTAINERS ONLY FOR PLASTIC BOTTLES AND PAPER (NEWSPAPERS ONLY), OTHER HOUSEHOLD WASTE ENDS UP IN AN INCINERATOR – THE ENERGY IS USED FOR HEATING FLATS IN BRNO
